

JUSTICE AMENDMENT

A *justice* amendment would be twofold:

- 1.) a person would have the right to effective assistance of counsel in a civil matter if he can't afford it (the same as a criminal matter); and
- 2.) before any person or entity can file a lawsuit or bring charges against another person or entity, the evidence must be presented for evaluation according to the "Farr Factor." This is a percentage of likelihood that the alleged defendant is guilty of the wrong for which he is being accused. The "Farr Factor" is the determining factor in any legal claim before a lawsuit can be filed or charges brought. It must be divulged to all parties prior to any litigation, and is also used to calculate damages.

Example #1: Mr. X claims that Mr. Y destroyed his property. Mr. X takes his evidence to his attorney, who inputs the information into the computer to determine the "Farr Factor." (A computer program is written which takes into account each state's laws, statutes, case law, etc. pertaining to specific claims and/or charges, both civil and criminal. *) At the same time, Mr. Y takes his evidence to his attorney showing his innocence. Based on the combined evidence, the program will then yield a percentage of likelihood that Mr. Y is guilty, called the "Farr Factor." This factor is immediately divulged to Mr. X and Mr. Y. If the damages are estimated at \$10,000 and the factor is 75% **, then Mr. Y/his insurance company pays \$7,500 to Mr. X. If Mr. X disagrees with the factor and wants to pursue the case further, he can still have his attorney take it to trial. However, he should do so with the understanding that the "Farr Factor" will be allowed as evidence given to the judge/jury.

Example #2: A robbery occurs, and Mr. Z is seen running from the store where it happened. He is chased by police but not caught. Mr. Z is brought in for questioning. His home is searched, and a gun is found. The D.A. inputs their evidence into the system to determine the "Farr Factor." If the percentage of likelihood that Mr. Z committed the crime is 75%* or better, then Mr. Z is arrested and charged. If not, the D.A. cannot arrest Mr. Z or bring charges until more evidence is received which would increase the "Farr Factor" to the appropriate level.

Advantages:

Lawyers can no longer drag out legal matters to cause emotional distress.
All cases are decided on their merits and not technicalities, so that true justice prevails.
Socioeconomic status of a person or entity is not a factor - the side with the most money to pay their attorney no longer wins, allowing for justice for *all*.
Other influences (i.e., future business promised to an attorney) is no longer a factor, ensuring justice.
Heart attacks, cancer, death and other health problems in clients/witnesses are reduced.
False and frivolous charges, as well as arrogance in our legal system, will be reduced and/or eliminated.
The wrong people are not arrested, tried, sent to jail and/or executed.
Overcrowding and the need for new prisons is reduced.
Justice is rendered more quickly and the legal system becomes efficient.
The poor can no longer take advantage of the rich by filing frivolous lawsuits.
The rich can no longer take advantage of the poor by ignoring/dismissing valid claims.
The legal system can no longer dismiss meritorious claims that are brought.
Lawsuits and the fear of lawsuits (stress) is reduced significantly; people feel more free.
Lawsuit damages will become fair.
Oppression is lifted, and our government/legal system is respected again.
The A.H.A! and other watchdog agencies will not need to exist.
We will finally have honest attorneys, who do their job right.
A person is truly innocent until proven guilty.
America is viewed as a leader among nations again.
Government and big business becomes fair and just.
Constitutional freedoms are restored, people are less angry, violence and crime is decreased.
There will be "justice for *all*" as stated in the Pledge of Allegiance.
God approves of this effort toward bridging the gap between the rich and the poor.

Disadvantages:

Attorneys will make less money.
